New Bulls:

- 1. Mouthed for age, reject if greater than 18 months (erupted mature incisor)
- 2. Must weight at least 700 lb.
- 3. Ear notch for PI BVDV
- 4. Vaccinate
 - a. Vista 5 + 5L SQ with Vibrio repeat in 3-8 weeks b. Calvary 9 repeat in 3-8 weeks
- 5. Parasite Control with pour-on for lice and internal parasites
- 6. SQ Oxytet-200 4.5ml per 100 lb (to clear Lepto Hardjo kidney colonization)O

Current Breeding Bulls:

- 1. Vet check every bull on the premises every 6 months
- 2. No bull should be used for more than 12 months.
- 3. Booster Vista with Vibrio every 6 months
- 4. Check for lameness daily and move to rest pen immediately if lame.
- 5. Establish a resting pen that feeds lactating cow TMR refusals (higher in fiber with less cottonseed and energy)
- 6. Monitor attitude daily, cull ASAP if bull becomes aggressive or difficult to handle.
- 7. Check daily that bulls are in the correct pen and that the bull to cow ratio is correct. For free-stall dairy, maintain 1 bull for every 20 open cows, for pastured herds maintain 1 bull for 25 open cows. Rotate in fresh bulls every 14 days from the resting pen. After pregnancy palpation day, revaluate these ratios and adjust accordingly.
